



Should scientists consider it part of their job to inform the public about their research and its impact on society?




Strong majorities across political affiliation, education, race and ethnicity

Strong majorities across political affiliation, education, race and ethnicity





And yet, despite "demand" for science, scientists and the scientific enterprise are all too invisible in our society...

Can you name a living scientist?





Only half can name a medical or health research institution


Can you name any institution, company, or organization where medical or health research is conducted?

- Inspire the next generation of STEM




Addressing the disconnect through civic engagement

- Provide training, mentoring, and up to \$3,000 in funding for project costs
- Connect with like-minded early career scientists
- Build new skills and your resume
- Explore careers outside of academia
- Dive into the intersection between science and public policy







Examples of Recent Microgrants

- Lighting Up Minds, Dimming the Skies gave talks at elementary schools in Santa Cruz County,
 CA, to introduce concepts of light pollution and its connection to astronomy.
- Kentucky Advocates for Science Policy and Research organized a research symposium at the state capital called "Building Bridges: Fostering Understanding Between Lawmakers and the Scientific Community."
- Black Scientist Collective at Baylor College of Medicine hosted a health literacy fair tackling disparities within maternal health, chronic illness, and infectious diseases.
- Science Unlocked based in Washington, D.C., engaged incarcerated youth by developing and hosting hands-on science experiments as part of the youth's regular curriculum.
